Whom was born Jesus who is called Christ

A Message for Adults

- People with inquiring minds have to know. When you hear something astounding, witness someone remarkable, or want bona fides about something or one; have you ever raised the question "Who is that?" Certainly you have. Tabloid newspapers exist only because you have the right to know, and they obtain truths hidden from the world that are revealed only to their investigative reporters.
- Indulge in the pretense that you live two thousand years ago under Roman authority in a

district of Palestine. You are an investigative reporter for the *Roman Inquirer*, on assignment and want to obtain truths hidden from the world about whom was born Jesus, who is called Christ (Matthew 1: 16 ASV). This is your finished column:

• Text: Hebrews 1: 1-5 ASV

God, having of old time spoken unto the fathers in the prophets by divers portions and in divers manners, hath at the end of these days spoken unto us in his Son, whom he appointed heir of

all things, through whom also he made the worlds; who being the effulgence [(radiantly bright)] of his glory, and the very image of his substance, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had made purification of sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high; having become by so much better than the angels, as he hath inherited a more excellent name than they. For unto which of the angels said God at any time? Thou art my Son, This day have I begotten thee? I will be to him a Father, And he shall be to me a Son?

 The writer of this column must have been trained in Greek oratory. The basic idea that whom was born Jesus who is called Christ alone brings to men the full revelation of God, and that He alone enables men to enter into the very presence of God. So the writer begins by contrasting Jesus with the prophets who had gone before. He talks about Jesus coming in the end of these days. The Jews divided all time into two ages; the present age and the age to come. In between they set the Day of the Lord.

The present age was wholly human and wholly bad; the age to come was to be the golden age of God. The Day of the Lord, in between, was to be the birth pangs of a new age. This writer says, "The old time is passing away; the age of incompleteness is gone; the time of human guessing and groping is at end; the new age of God has dawned in Christ." He saw the world and the thoughts of man enter, as it were, into a new beginning with Jesus Christ. In Jesus, God had entered humanity, eternity had invaded

time, and things could never be the same again.

 He chooses to begin contrast with Jesus with the prophets, for the prophets were always believed to be in the secret counsels of God. Long ago Amos said: surely the Lord Jehovah will do nothing, except he reveal His secret unto His servants the prophets. Amos 3: 7 ASV God uses the prophets and interpreters as instruments to reveal to men that which He wills. God could not reveal more than men could understand.

God's revelation comes through the minds and hearts of men. The investigative reporter obtained truths hidden from the world that were revealed only to him. That is exactly what the writer reported.

 The writer says the revelation of God, the truth, which came through the prophets, was in many parts. From age to age the prophets had spoken, always fitting their message to their age, always seizing that facet of the truth which was relevant to men to whom they spoke. It

was never a static worn out thing. It was never out of date and irrelevant and incomprehensible. It was adapted to the need of every age. At the same time, the revelation was fragmentary. Each prophet, out of his experience of life, and out of the experience of Israel, had grasped and expressed a part of the truth of God; but with Jesus it was different. Jesus was not a part of the truth; He was the whole truth. He was not a fragmentary revelation of God; He was the full revelation of

God. In Him God displayed not some facet of His truth; God displayed Himself full revealed to men. The prophet had to use human methods to transmit his part of the truth of God. Again, it was different with Jesus. Jesus revealed God by being Himself. It was not so much what He said and did that shows us what God is like; it is what He is. The revelation of the prophets was great and manifold, but it was fragmentary and presented in such methods as they could find to make it effective; but the revelation of God in

Jesus was complete, and was presented in Jesus Himself. The prophets were friends of God; but Jesus was the Son. The prophets grasped part of the mind of God; but Jesus was the mind of God.

 It needs be noted that this writer had no part to belittle the prophets; it is his aim to establish the supremacy of Jesus Christ. He is not saying there is a break between the Old Testament revelation and that of the New Testament; he is stressing the fact there is continuity.

- This writer tells us six great things about Jesus.
 - 1. The glory of God belongs to Him. He is the effulgence of God's glory. The glory of God is not shattering power, but suffering love.
 - 2. The destined empire belongs to Jesus. The New Testament never doubts the triumph of Jesus.
 - 3. God created the world through His Son. The One who made the world will be the One who redeems the world.

- 4. Sustaining power belongs to Jesus. He carries the doctrine of providence.
- 5. Jesus sacrifice has borne our griefs, carried our sorrows; was wounded for our transgressions, was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. He is the purification of sins.
- 6. Jesus is our mediator. At the right hand of God, He makes intercession for us.

 Now we all know bona fides about whom was born Jesus, who is called Christ. People with inquiring minds have to know.
