Advent of Time A Message for Adults

Week of Sunday 20 August, 2017 A.D. (Anno Domini – In the year of our Lord)

Sunday 29 Av, 5777

- Advent means arrival.
- The ancients marked time by sunset. Sunset to sunset is one Hebrew (yom) day. In six days the LORD made heaven and earth, and rested the seventh day. (Exodus 20: 11) Seven days is a week.
- The ancients reckoned periods of time from well known events. They would remember an event happened after another more significant event, like after the death of Moses. (Joshua 1: 1)
- The ancients observed moon phases. The

ancient Hebrews gave each new moon a name; 12 lunar months; 354 days, 8 hours, 38 seconds; is a lunar year. The Sacred Hebrew Calendar months are reckoned to the moon. The LORD spake unto Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying, This month [shall be] unto you the beginning of months: it [shall be] the first month of the year to you. (Exodus 12: 1-2) It was Nisan, and reckons to our March or April. The first month, has 30 days.

This message for the week of 20 August 2017

reckons 28 Av 5777, the fifth month on the Sacred Hebrew calendar. The month has 30 days, and reckons to our July or August. This month is of special note for; Aaron the priest went up into mount Hor at the commandment of the LORD, and died there, in the fortieth year after the children of Israel were come out of the land of Egypt, in the first [day] of the fifth month. (Numbers 33: 38) The ninth day of Av is a sad day on the calendar for the Hebrew nation. Tuesday, August 1, 2017 reckoned 9 Av 5777 this year.

It is the day the LORD decreed the Hebrew nation would wander in the desert for forty years. The two Temples in Jerusalem were destroyed on this day. The first crusade and the liquidating of the Warsaw ghetto were both on the 9th of Av. It is a day of mourning!

• Numbering of the months from the Passover month (Exodus12: 1-2) is applied in the Pentateuch (First five OT books) and in a few sacred biblical histories. Thus it is called the Sacred Hebrew Calendar. As trade increased and

government, a civil calendar became essential, to reconcile contracts. These needs birthed a Civil calendar. The Civil calendar recognized the seventh sacred month as the first month. The month Tishri, reckons to our September or October, and is beginning of the Jewish Civil year.

The chart below will help with understanding.

- Is Jesus giving a warning sign to prepare disciples, as the sun becomes black as sackcloth, Monday, August 21, 2017? Is scripture being fulfilled; of that day and hour knoweth no one, not even the angels of heaven, neither the Son, but the Father only (Matthew 24: 36); because man chooses to disregard instruction from the LORD? Are you ready for judgment?
- Allow me to summarize: The LORD instructed mankind how to keep time focused on feasts of

dedication, using a lunar day from sunset to sunset. Man chose to keep time observing trade and government and focused on items of his interest instead of His. Scripture teaches no one but the LORD knows the great and terrible day, except Jehovah.

 Disregarding the Sacred calendar man disregards the signs and does not have understanding. Is scripture being fulfilled because of mans wisdom?
